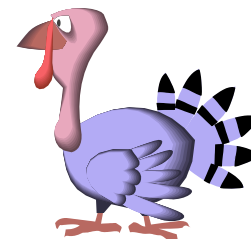

Trucksgiving by Jon Scieszka

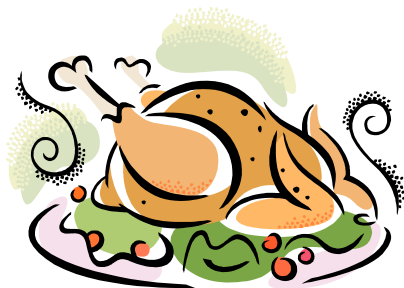

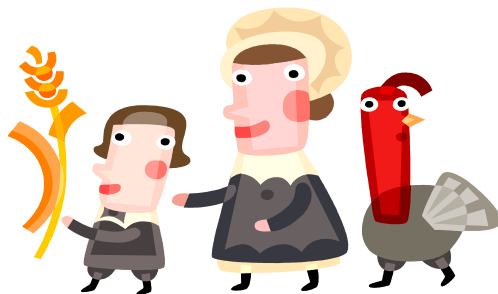
