The WATT DETECTIVE is an energy efficiency education program offered by ComEd in partnership with local libraries. You can check out the WATT DETECTIVE kit to learn more about your energy use at home and find ways to save energy and money.

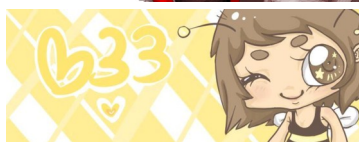

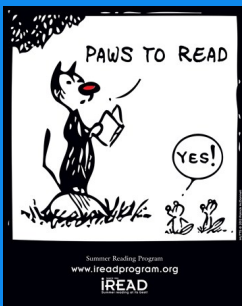

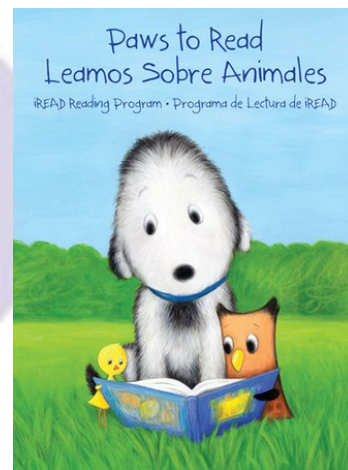
